


## CY Leung Luggage Accident at Hong Kong Airport

# An Interview with Karen Kwan

I: Interviewer K: Karen

Karen Kwan was a student graduated from FLSS and now studying **Science and Technology in Hong Kong Polytechnic University**. We had an interview with her and she shared her experience in secondary school and university.



I: How's your university life?

K: I think overall it is fruitful and wonderful, there are some **differences between my expectations and the actual university life**. But still, this has been a very enriching experience. I would say that it has been the most wonderful part of my life so far.

I: Do you have any future plans? what would you like to do when you graduate?

K: I'm graduating next year, you might think I should have a future plan, but I haven't really thought about that too hard. I think I'd further my study in a master programme or become a research student as I'm studying food safety and technology. My professors are doing much research around this topic, so maybe I will be a research student. But if I don't keep on studying I will just find a job in a related field like food safety and science.

I: How do you allocate your time during examinations?

K: In the university, examinations are so different than those in secondary school. In the university they teach you everything new in one semester and you have to learn all of them, I mean for science subjects. Actually, while you don't have time to memorise all the materials, you have to be **wise and critical** in selecting what materials should be memorised, studied or understood thoroughly. It is essential that you pay a lot of attention in class so that you can focus on analysing what to memorise among all the materials. Sometimes the timetable may clash between two subjects and you have to **plan and prioritise your study options** ahead of time.

I: How do you strike a balance between social life and studying?

K: To be honest, I think social life is more important than studying during university. In my opinion, we have already done so much studying in our first eighteen years that it's time we also **broaden and deepen our roles with societal perspectives**. University is a place that you can make many new friends and position yourself within the society. Some people say you can't have good grades and many good friends at the same time but I think you can achieve a meaningful balance with both.

I: Are there any tips on studying biology?

K: Rather than memorising all the materials we should be aware of **the connection and relationships between things**, like the body system, the immune system and the digest system. You can't just memorise them separately, you have to know and understand the connection between them. When you're taking an exam, be aware of the marking scheme if the questions worth 3 marks, then you should write 3 related points.

I: Do you have any tips on studying chemistry?

K: I'm not really good at chemistry but still I think chemistry is even more interesting than biology somehow because chemistry is something between biology and physics. I would say that you should be **good at calculations**. And yes, thinking of it as an interesting subject and it will make you feel more comfortable while studying it.

I: What motivates you the most to get into university?

K: The biggest motivation is from Mr Sze, in an interesting way. Because he said that university life is really good, interesting, and funny and offers opportunities in meeting many new friends. Don't just take university as a place where you receive a degree. You also learn to be self-disciplined in your quest for knowledge, because no one will supervise you constantly in university.

I: We heard you are making a magazine, can you describe what the magazine is and its aim?

K: There's a reason behind why the magazine is called "頂理", not just because it's swearing, "頂" means 頂住, "理" means "理工大學" (Polytechnic University). The reason behind it is that we are supporting something that we believe and the magazine is mostly about social issues. We have a different themes in each issue, last time the theme was **"university life"**, and the theme before that was about SEN --special educational needs (特殊學習需要). Every time we talk about a social issue, it's not necessary to be politicised like the **Pan-democrats (泛民)** and the **Pro-Beijing camp (建制)**, but we would want to bring out something that we see as important happening in the society when people ignore it, so we bring out the issue to make people aware of it. Also we have columns in our magazine about music, reading, movies etc. We just want to keep it funny and on a "100 毛" style because we think if it's boring no one would like to read it. I created the magazine because I want to share my experience about university life. It allows me to **broaden my horizon** in meeting people from different sectors of the society. The app uses GPS so it knows your starting location and you can quickly add any location.


You can choose a postal code,...etc. for your destination input. It is right every time, even when we tried wandering off so many times.....




If you're interested in politics, you may choose to enter the faculty of social science in your Jupas application form.

# Éclair

*Éclair*, originated from 18th century in France, was once the afternoon delighting snack for the French nobles. It has become popular all around the globe due to its crispiness and delicious cream filling. Now, let's bring this luxurious pastry to your home and present it to your loved ones.



## Procedure

### Pastry

1. Pour some water and put some butter into a saucepan and bring them to a boil.
2. Sprinkle flour into the boiling liquid and rapidly stir it to combine them into a dough .
3. Cut off the heat and keep stirring the dough until it is cool enough to touch.
4. Add the whole beaten eggs little by little and vigorous fold and stir the batter.
5. Put the batter in a piping bag and squeeze out the mixture into long strips, each a length of 10 centimeters, and then put in a preheated oven at 180°C for 20 minutes. Put them on a cool rack after baking.

### Cream filling

1. Beat the egg yolk and sugar in a bowl until it turns pale yellow.
2. Add the flour into the mixture and simultaneously pour the milk into a saucepan and bring it to a simmer.
3. When the milk is lukewarm, pour the milk to the egg mixture and whisk in zigzag motion.
4. While the mixture is well mixed, put it on the stove and stir until it thickens up.
5. When the cream is formed, transfer it to a container and seal it , and put into the refrigerator

## Final set up

1. Scoop the cream into a pipe bag with nozzle and make some whole under the eclairs.
2. Pipe the cream into the puffs and put them in to the refrigerator and it could last for 4 days.

Song Joong-ki is a South Korean actor and host. In 2010, he has won <3rd Style Icon Awards>, <KBS popularity Award>, <SBS Entertainment Awards>. In 2011, he has won <SBS Drama Awards>, <1st K-Drama Star Awards>, <KBS Top Excellence Award, Actor> etc. After his mandatory military service, In 2016, he has also got the Style Icon award <8th Style Icon Asia> and so on.

Japan, where most paranormal things take place, has a very famous urban legend.



Some people believe this story but some don't due to lack of proof and too much suspicion. But no matter whether it's real or fake, this is definitely horrifying.





## 2. Hide it inside your pen




